WILSFORD PARISH COUNCIL

Councillors welcomed new councillor Keith Corner to the Parish Council at their last meeting. He was co-opted on after Phil Bramley resigned.

Dog Fouling is becoming a real issue in the village. This is an offence and parishioners are asked to clean up after their dogs. There are no excuses, we have dog bins situated on the playing field, rear of the village hall, back footpath from Post Office to School Lane and one at Town End. You can use the normal waste bins which are at the Post Office, near the Plough and on Heath Lane. You can also put them in your own waste bin. If anyone feels there should be further dog bins please contact the Clerk <u>wilsfordpc@gmail.com</u> and the Parish Council will consider purchasing a further bin.

Dogs are not allowed to run free on the children's area of the playing field, so please keep your dogs on a lead. The Parish Council will be purchasing signs to remind parishioners. 'Clean up after your dog' signs will also be purchased.

Parking on Footpaths on Main Street has been brought to the attention of the Parish Council. Please be considerate to prams, pushchairs, and wheelchair users.

Chevrons and the bollards in the lay-by have been reported as damaged.

Census 2021 will take place in April. This will be a digital-first census where people are encouraged to fill in online. Householders will receive a letter with a unique access code in the post, allowing them to complete online. Paper questionnaires will be available on request.

Play equipment will be upgraded on the playing field. A recent report showed areas which needed maintenance and replacing. Two new seats have already been replaced. The Parish Council have earmarked a maximum of £6000 to repair the equipment. General maintenance will be taking place over the next few weeks including clearing overgrowth of moss and weeds. If restrictions allow a working party will be formed to clean down all the equipment before Easter.

A new Fingerpost will be purchased to replace the one outside the Plough. This is now in such a bad state it cannot be cleaned properly.

Grit Bins are being well used by parishioners. Cllrs thank everyone who is doing their bit to keep the roads and paths clear in Wilsford during this bad weather. However, just a reminder to close the lids on the bins after use. If you notice one is nearly empty or empty please contact the Clerk and she will arrange for them to be refilled.

Queens Platinum Jubilee is 06 February 2022. The May Bank Holiday weekend will be moved to Thursday 02 June and there will be an additional Bank Holiday on Friday 03 June, this will see a four-day weekend to celebrate her Majesty the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. The Parish Council are looking into ways this may be celebrated in the village. Any ideas please forward to the Clerk.

County Councillor Andrew Hagues said work will begin on Holdingham Roundabout from 15 February. Although a lot of the work will be done over night there will still be traffic restrictions.

The elections for County and Police and Crime Commissioner are still scheduled to take place on 06 May. People will be able to vote in person at polling stations, but it is advised to request a postal vote which you can take to the polling station on the day if you wish.

Farming – a changed landscape. From 1939 until tomorrow. Henry Tickler who farms the land around Wilsford and Kelby. I asked Henry to write about his changes to an emphasis on wildlife conservation on the land, here and in the wider farming community.

Our shops and supermarkets have not always been as full as they are today in terms of both quantity and quality. Up until 1954, food rationing, for some products was still in place following The Second World War. Successive Governments, up until comparatively recently ensured that many hedgerows were pulled up, and horses were replaced by tractors. These two fundamentals ensured that larger fields were created.

Over the next five or so years, conservation measures will become an integral part of political changes. Although some farmers have already replaced

hedgerows, committed land to woodland, excavated ponds and lakes - thus creating crucially habitats important new for wildlife. Currently the mandatory formation of two metre grass margins around arable fields have been very successful for some species, including the Barn Owl. This process will be extended through ELMS (Environmental Land Management Scheme), as the European-based farm subsidy arrangement is replaced with an emphasis of conservation alongside measures food production.

Coupled with the change, will be a more balanced mix of agriculture and conservation in which "carbon

capture" and important issues regarding protecting our most important asset, soil. Farmers will be encouraged to become carbon neutral, which will include better and more effective use of, for example, fertilisers. Nitrogen, is arguably one of the most important raw materials that farmers have at their disposal, and simplistically comes from one of three sources: inorganic/bagged nitrogenbased fertiliser, organic manures from livestock production, and leguminous plants such as clovers, peas, beans, etc.

To finish: I know that many of you that walk along our footpaths, and across our fields, have commented about the signs that I have displayed at entrances to both Hall and Slate House Farms. I had them put up on the 16th November last year after one individual walker (with dogs) behaved in a manner that convinced me that he alone was totally indifferent to local livestock and wildlife. Some five weeks or so later, this individual, allowed his dogs to savage a 5-week old lamb, ripping a foot square lump of wool and skin from the animal, exposing the muscle to the elements. It might be ok if the dogs were on leads, and we are encouraging the kids not to be frightened of them, but not all kids like dogs and it is pretty terrifying for them if dogs bigger than them come running towards them when they're playing on the equipment.
